
The data was collected during an anonymous survey carried out in June 2025. Participating was voluntary. Our statistics are based on the responses received.


Definitions


"Partners" includes partners who are members of Brecher LLP and employees of the LLP of equivalent standing and qualifications or experience.


"Other Fee-Earners" includes solicitors and all other qualified and non-qualified members of staff who undertake fee-earning work.

"Business Support" includes directors, managers and other members of staff who work in business services functions, and all of our Executive Assistants.









WHAT WAS THE OCCUPATION OF YOUR MAIN HOUSEHOLD EARNER WHEN YOU WERE ABOUT 14?






